Others citizens say it is a harmless trend that won't last long and will likely never be repeated. -DANI ALCORN



Marathon: Just Too Long?

n the recent race from Marathon to Sparta — a staggering 26 miles four athletes collapsed from exhaustion. "The average god-fearing human cannot run 26 miles, after the ritual sacrifices and feasting for the 12 hours prior to the race," says Doctor Hippocrates.

After being treated for dehydration and severe muscle cramps the athletes were carried on to Marathon by chariot. Competitor Zeno Citium however chose to stay in Athens "because the drinkin's better." Unlike Anastasios Argvros and Demetrios Epiktetos who made it 14 miles, and Kallikrates Lysander who made it 21 miles, Citium collapsed in a drunken stuper after only 100 yards.

Nine of the ten competitors voted for shortening the race,

however the winner, Philokrates Praxiteles. says he thought it was an easy event and should be lengthened. However when asked if he was present for the sacrifices and party he was unavailable for comment.

Hippocrate's original

proposal was to eliminate the sacrifices, but he hastily withdrew his proposal after being threatened with banishment. He now proposes to change the race from Sparta to Athens. The gods will be asked next week at the temple of Zeus if Sparta would be acceptable.

In any event the race should be shortened and

Father Absenteeism

ore and more youths are troubled by absent fathers every year. Doctor Pantaleon Xenocrates from the University of Ephyra has proven that youths without father figures are a danger to themselves and to Greece. "Just look what happened to Phaethon," says

Xenocrates. "I mean. the kid set half of Greece on fire.* Incidents like these are a direct result of absent father figures."

Theseus, son of King Agamemnon, also lacked a defined father figure. His father didn't want to deal with diapers and so waited until his son was big enough to lift a rock before welcoming him to the kingdom.

More and more of these shocking developments occur every year. Doctor Xenocrates says the solution to these problems is better care-giving facilities. "Maybe if fathers didn't have to deal with their kids so much they'd stick around longer."

Athenian tax collections should be used to fund a study to quantify the relationship between at-home fathers and childhood accidents. -DANI ALCORN


a few of his students but other Doctors such as Theophlaktos Timo are skeptical of whether this is a good idea. Timo commented, "this would never last."



The supplicant has decided that he will hold off joining the Delian League for now thinking that it was Apollo's way of saying "Stupid Question".



New **Species** Discovered

ast month a new species was discovered by Bellaraphon. The species is an unusual mixture of bird and horse. Originally thought to be mythical, the creature explained, "The bridle is the only reason Pegasus is tame. If anyone removes the bridle he instantly becomes wild and attempts escape. Fortunately this time he was already in the holding facility. As for Erato he should be back on his foot in a few weeks."

When questioned about where he got



has been named "Pegasus." It was flown from its forest in Sicily to a holding facility near Mount Olympus.

A near miss occurred when caretaker Herakles Erato accidentally took Pegasus' bridle off. Later that day during a press conference Bellaraphon

the "magic" bridle he indicated only that it was a gift from the gods.

Kallisto Leto who has studied Pegasus in detail. described him for us in an eyewitness interview. "Pegasus is similar to a normal horse. His bone structure is the same, but the bones are hollow, like a bird . His shoulders,

however, branch off into giant wings, with a wingspan of at least 20 feet. The muscle groups there are so complex it will take weeks of watching him fly to figure them out."

Stable manager Klytie Iachuss discussed his daily routine. "I haven't figured out what it eats yet. He seems to live off moonlight, as far as I can figure. Anyway, we take him out in the morning and let him fly with Bellaraphon, then he comes back and we bathe him and comb his wings, then the philosophers come and poke and prod at him until we stable him for the night."

Pegasus' discovery has given the scientific community quite a shock. Doctor Daedalus has studied Pegasus' wing structure and speculates that humans, too, can fly.

Daedalus is working on a machine he hopes will enable humans to emulate Pegasus, however his recent tests with his son have been somewhat less than successful (see Transitions).
